

Forbes Reports 151,352 Layoffs for January Itself; Employment Authority Proposes Alternative Job Search Approach

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Pasadena, CA — According to a compilation by *Forbes* recently, there were 151,352 layoffs at America's 500 largest public companies in the month of January. This is a huge number in itself, without taking into count the layoffs which have taken a toll in other companies and industries this month. Other companies which suffered huge layoffs were Alcoa (13,500 jobs), Textron (2,000 jobs), Motorola (4,000 jobs), Hertz Global Holdings (4,000 jobs), General Motors (2,000 jobs), Home Depot (7,000 jobs), and Microsoft (5,000 jobs).

Barnes adds, "It is predicted by many analysts that unemployment rates will rise to double digits by the end of this year.
